*Christmas Bicycle Giveaway Program Reaches New Heights  
 More than 250 bicycles expected to be given away through local programs*

This has been the biggest year yet for Sheriff Webre's annual bicycle giveaway at Christmas time. Over the past couple of months there has been about 325 requests for bicycles. Bikes are given to the Angles Tree program; Thibodaux Toy Drive; Raceland Middle School; Raceland Lower Elementary; and Grand Isle. About 35% of the bikes this year were given to children of displaced families caused by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. Last year 200 bikes were given to children in Lafourche Parish. This year the total will exceed 250.

There are always more requests than bikes. Every effort is made to distribute the bikes as far as possible and geographically balanced. Deputies have also provided new bikes for the program. "Spanky" Day has Explorers lined up to distribute bikes the week before Christmas. Water Patrol guys and other deputies also pitch in to help. This year 40 new bikes were donated by a Thibodaux business-hours and on weekends for several months before Christmas. The entire back lot of the South Lafourche Sub-

station is filled with hundreds of bikes and bike parts during this period. The Sheriff's Office will have had an opportunity to favorably impact almost 200 families this year through this program. Particularly this year, it makes for a very Merry Christmas for a bunch of kids who may otherwise have not had a bike to call their own this year.
